AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE EFFICACY OF ARIZONA'S MOVE OVER LAW STUDY COMMITTEE.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Efficacy of Arizona's move over law study
3 committee; membership; duties; report; delayed
4 repeal

5 A. The efficacy of Arizona's move over law study committee is
6 established consisting of the following members:

7 1. Two members of the senate, each from a different political
8 party, who are appointed by the president of the senate. The president of
9 the senate shall designate one of these members to serve as cochairperson
10 of the study committee.

11 2. Two members of the house of representatives, each from a
12 different political party, who are appointed by the speaker of the house
13 of representatives. The speaker of the house of representatives shall
14 designate one of these members to serve as cochairperson of the study
15 committee.

16 3. The director of the department of transportation or the
17 director's designee.

18 4. Two representatives who are appointed by the department of
19 public safety.

20 5. One representative of the towing and recovery industry who is
21 appointed by the governor.

22 B. The study committee shall meet at the call of the
23 cochairpersons.

24 C. Study committee members are not eligible to receive
25 compensation.

26 D. The study committee shall:

27 1. Conduct a comprehensive study to determine the efficacy of
28 section 28-775, subsection E, Arizona Revised Statutes, to determine if
29 additional promotion and education of the law are needed to ensure greater
30 effectiveness and additional safety measures to help drivers better comply
31 with yielding to emergency vehicles.

32 2. Identify any additional resources or policy initiatives that
33 would enhance public safety or improve the efficacy of section 28-775,
34 Arizona Revised Statutes.

35 3. Propose legislation to address issues identified by the study
36 committee.

37 4. Review current policies and practices and propose revisions to
38 improve safety matters for first responders and citizens.

39 5. On or before December 1, 2025, submit a report regarding the
40 study committee's activities, findings and recommendations for
41 administrative or legislative action to the governor, the president of the
42 senate and the speaker of the house of representatives and provide a copy
43 of this report to the secretary of state.

44 E. This section is repealed from and after September 30, 2026.
