AMENDING LAWS 2024, CHAPTER 209, SECTION 129; RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
 2 Section 1. Laws 2024, chapter 209, section 129 is amended to read:  
 3 Sec. 129. Lump sum reductions; fiscal year 2024-2025  
 4 A. In addition to any other appropriations made in fiscal year  
 5 2024-2025, the following state general fund amounts are reduced from lump  
 6 sum appropriations for the following budget units in fiscal year

20 policy institute and the university of Arizona center for the philosophy  
21 of freedom by more than 3.45 percent of the total amount allocated to the  
22 school, institute or center.
