### **AN ACT**

AMENDING SECTIONS 32-501, 32-502, 32-504, 32-506, 32-507, 32-510, 32-511, 32-512 AND 32-512.01, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; REPEALING SECTION 32-512.02, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; AMENDING TITLE 32, CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE 2, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 32-512.02; AMENDING SECTIONS 32-515, 32-518, 32-531, 32-532, 32-533, 32-536, 32-537, 32-543, 32-545, 32-551, 32-552 AND 32-563, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO THE BARBERING AND COSMETOLOGY BOARD.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Section 32-501, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4 32-501. Definitions

5 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

6 1. "Aesthetician" means a person who is licensed to practice  
7 aesthetics pursuant to this chapter.

8 2. "Aesthetics" means any one or a combination of the following  
9 practices if they are performed for cosmetic purposes OF THE STRATUM  
10 CORNEUM OF THE EPIDERMAL LAYER OF THE SKIN SURFACE:

11 (a) Massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising,  
12 beautifying or applying oils, creams, antiseptics, clays, lotions or other  
13 preparations, either by hand or by mechanical or electrical appliances ON  
14 A PERSON'S FACE, NECK, ARMS, LEGS OR TRUNK.

15 (b) Arching eyebrows, ~~or~~ tinting eyebrows and eyelashes OR APPLYING  
16 EYELASH EXTENSIONS.

17 (c) Removing superfluous hair by means other than electrolysis or  
18 threading.

19 (d) USING CHEMICALS TO ALTER THE HAIR STRUCTURE ON THE FACE,  
20 INCLUDING LASH LIFTS AND BROW LAMINATIONS.

21 (e) BASIC EXFOLIATION, MANUAL OR MACHINE SKIN CLEANSING AND BASIC  
22 EXTRACTIONS.

23 3. "Barber" means a person who is licensed to practice barbering  
24 pursuant to this chapter.

25 4. "Barbering" means any one or a combination of the following  
26 practices if they are performed on a person's head, face, neck or  
27 shoulders for cosmetic purposes:

28 (a) Cutting, clipping or trimming hair.

29 (b) Massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising,  
30 beautifying or applying oils, creams, antiseptics, clays, lotions or other  
31 preparations, either by hand or by mechanical or electrical appliances.

32 (c) Styling, arranging, dressing, curling, waving, permanent  
33 waving, straightening, cleansing, singeing, bleaching, dyeing, tinting,  
34 coloring or similarly treating hair.

35 (d) Providing hair attachments, extensions, hairpieces and wigs  
36 when performed by a barber.

37 (e) Shaving or trimming a beard.

38 (f) Providing skin care, including facials, corrective treatments,  
39 blackhead and acne removal and masks and treatment creams.

40 (g) Removing unwanted hair by means other than electrolysis or  
41 threading, INCLUDING USING A STRAIGHT RAZOR TO REMOVE HAIR FROM THE HEAD,  
42 FACE AND NECK.

43 5. "Board" means the barbering and cosmetology board.

1       6. "Cosmetic purposes" means for the purpose of beautifying,  
2       preserving or conferring comeliness, excluding therapeutic massage and  
3       manipulations.

4       7. "Cosmetologist" means a person who is licensed to practice  
5       cosmetology pursuant to this chapter.

6       8. "Cosmetology" means any one or a combination of the following  
7       practices if they are performed for cosmetic purposes:

8       (a) Massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising,  
9       beautifying or applying oils, creams, antiseptics, clays, lotions or other  
10      preparations, either by hand or by mechanical or electrical appliances **ON**  
11      **A PERSON'S SCALP, FACE, NECK, ARMS, LEGS OR TRUNK.**

12      (b) Arching eyebrows, ~~or~~ tinting eyebrows and eyelashes **OR APPLYING**  
13      **EYELASH EXTENSIONS.**

14      (c) Removing superfluous hair by means other than electrolysis or  
15      threading.

16      (d) **USING CHEMICALS TO ALTER HAIR STRUCTURE ON THE FACE, INCLUDING**  
17      **LASH LIFTS AND BROW LAMINATIONS.**

18      (e) **BASIC EXFOLIATION, MANUAL OR MACHINE SKIN CLEANSING AND BASIC**  
19      **EXTRACTIONS.**

20      ~~(d)~~ (f) Nail technology.

21      ~~(e)~~ (g) Hairstyling.

22      9. "Electrical appliances" means devices that use electrical  
23      current and includes lasers and IPL devices as defined in section 32-516.

24      10. "Establishment" means any of the following:

25      (a) An establishment ~~or shop~~ that is operated for the purpose of  
26      engaging in the practice of barbering, cosmetology, aesthetics, nail  
27      technology, hairstyling or eyelash extensions or any combination of the  
28      practices listed in this subdivision.

29      (b) An establishment ~~or shop~~ together with a retrofitted motor  
30      vehicle that is used exclusively as a mobile facility for the purpose of  
31      engaging in the practice of barbering, cosmetology, aesthetics, nail  
32      technology or hairstyling or any combination of the practices listed in  
33      this subdivision and that is operated and dispatched through the  
34      establishment.

35      ~~(c) A retrofitted motor vehicle that is exclusively used as a~~  
36      ~~mobile facility for the purpose of engaging in the practice of barbering,~~  
37      ~~cosmetology, aesthetics, nail technology or hairstyling or any combination~~  
38      ~~of the practices listed in this subdivision and that is operated and~~  
39      ~~dispatched from a business that has a physical street address on file with~~  
40      ~~the board.~~

41      11. "Eyelash extensions":

42      (a) Means applying, removing and trimming threadlike natural or  
43      synthetic fibers to an eyelash.

1 (b) Includes cleansing the eye area and lashes.

2 (c) Does not include applying eyelash enhancements that are  
3 tattoos, color agents, straightening agents, permanent wave solutions or  
4 bleaching agents to the eyebrow or any other cosmetology service.

5 12. "Eyelash technician" means a person who is not licensed as a  
6 cosmetologist or aesthetician and who for compensation performs personal  
7 services limited to eyelash extensions.

8 13. "Hairstyling" means any of the following:

9 (a) Cutting, clipping or trimming hair.

10 (b) PROCESSING, styling, arranging, dressing, curling, waving,  
11 permanent waving, straightening, cleansing, singeing, bleaching, dyeing,  
12 tinting, coloring or similarly treating hair.

13 (c) Removing superfluous hair from the neck up by means other than  
14 electrolysis or threading, INCLUDING USING A FEATHER RAZOR OR RAZOR WITH A  
15 GUARD OTHER THAN A STRAIGHT RAZOR TO REMOVE HAIR FROM THE HEAD, FACE AND  
16 NECK.

17 14. "Hairstylist" means a person who is licensed to practice  
18 hairstyling pursuant to this chapter.

19 15. "Instructor" means a person who is licensed to teach barbering,  
20 cosmetology, aesthetics, nail technology or hairstyling, or any  
21 combination of these practices, pursuant to this chapter.

22 16. "Mentor" means a cosmetologist, aesthetician, barber,  
23 hairstylist or nail technician who is approved by the board to train a  
24 person in a department of economic security-approved apprenticeship  
25 program in cosmetology or barbering in an establishment that is licensed  
26 by the board.

27 17. "Nail technician" means a person who is licensed to practice  
28 nail technology pursuant to this chapter.

29 18. "Nail technology" means any of the following:

30 (a) Cutting, trimming, polishing, coloring, tinting, cleansing or  
31 otherwise treating a person's nails.

32 (b) Applying artificial nails.

33 (c) Massaging and cleaning a person's hands, arms, legs and feet.

34 19. "School" means an establishment that is operated for the  
35 purpose of teaching barbering, cosmetology, aesthetics, nail technology or  
36 hairstyling, or any combination of these practices.

37 20. "Threading" means a service that results in the removal of hair  
38 from its follicle from around the eyebrows and from other parts of the  
39 face with the use of a single strand of cotton thread and an  
40 over-the-counter astringent, if the service does not use chemicals of any  
41 kind, wax or any implements, instruments or tools to remove hair.

1           Sec. 2. Section 32-502, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
2 read:

3           32-502. Barbering and cosmetology board; members;  
4           appointment; qualifications; terms; removal

5           A. The barbering and cosmetology board is established consisting of  
6 the following members who are appointed by the governor:

7           1. One cosmetologist, AESTHETICIAN, HAIRSTYLIST, NAIL TECHNICIAN OR  
8 LICENSED EDUCATOR who has actively practiced cosmetology, AESTHETICS,  
9 HAIRSTYLING OR NAIL TECHNOLOGY in this state for at least three years  
10 immediately preceding appointment.

11           2. Two school owners who do not own the same school, one of whom  
12 owns a school that teaches cosmetology, AESTHETICS, HAIRSTYLING OR NAIL  
13 TECHNOLOGY and one of whom owns a school that teaches barbering.

14           3. Five public members, preferably one of whom is an educator, who  
15 are not and have never been associated with the barbering, cosmetology,  
16 AESTHETICS, HAIRSTYLING or nail technology industry, licensed as a barber,  
17 cosmetologist, AESTHETICIAN, HAIRSTYLIST or nail technician or involved in  
18 manufacturing barbering, cosmetology, AESTHETICS or nail technology  
19 products.

20           4. One barber who has actively practiced barbering in this state  
21 for at least three years.

22           B. The term of office for members is three years beginning and  
23 ending June 22.

24           C. The governor may remove board members for neglect of duty,  
25 malfeasance or misfeasance.

26           Sec. 3. Section 32-504, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
27 read:

28           32-504. Powers and duties

29           A. The board shall:

30           1. Adopt rules that are necessary and proper to administer this  
31 chapter, including:

32           (a) Sanitary and safety requirements for establishments and  
33 schools.

34           (b) Sanitary and safety standards for the practices of barbering,  
35 cosmetology, aesthetics, nail technology, EYELASH TECHNOLOGY and  
36 hairstyling.

37           (c) Mobile facility requirements.

38           2. Administer and enforce this chapter and rules adopted pursuant  
39 to this chapter.

40           3. Either prepare, administer and grade practical and written  
41 examinations or contract with a national professional organization for  
42 aesthetics, barbering, cosmetology, hairstyling and nail technology that  
43 is selected by the board to prepare, administer and grade practical and  
44 written examinations.

1           4. Make and maintain a record of its acts and proceedings,  
2 including the issuance, denial, renewal, suspension or revocation of  
3 licenses and registrations and public reproofs of licensees and  
4 registrants.

5           5. Evidence its official acts by the signature of the chairperson  
6 or vice chairperson of the board or a representative designated by the  
7 board.

8           6. Keep records of the board open to public inspection at all  
9 reasonable times.

10          7. Prescribe minimum school curriculum requirements for barbers,  
11 cosmetologists, aestheticians, nail technicians, hairstylists and  
12 instructors.

13          8. Prescribe standards and requirements for the provision of  
14 establishment services through mobile facilities and in customer  
15 locations.

16          9. Approve an aesthetician, a barber, a cosmetologist, a  
17 hairstylist or a nail technician as a mentor based on the licensee's  
18 record of compliance with this chapter. The board may not condition the  
19 approval on the licensee's payment of an additional fee or completion of  
20 an additional requirement.

21           B. The board may:

22           1. Inspect the premises of any establishment or school during  
23 business hours.

24           2. Delegate authority to its executive director to issue licenses  
25 and registrations to applicants who meet the requirements of this chapter.

26          Sec. 4. Section 32-506, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
27 read:

28          32-506. Nonapplicability of chapter

29          This chapter does not apply to the following persons while in the  
30 proper discharge of their professional duties:

31           1. Medical practitioners who are licensed pursuant to this title if  
32 the practices treat physical or mental ailments or disease.

33           2. Commissioned physicians and surgeons who are serving in the  
34 armed forces of the United States or other federal agencies.

35           3. Persons who are licensed pursuant to chapter 12 of this title.

36           4. Students who are attending schools licensed by the board while  
37 they are on school premises during school hours or off campus at a  
38 school-sponsored event.

39           5. Persons employed by theatrical groups who apply makeup, oils and  
40 cosmetics.

41           6. Persons who sell makeup, oils and cosmetics and who apply such  
42 products during the process of selling such products.

43           7. Shampoo assistants who shampoo hair under the direction of a  
44 barber, cosmetologist or hairstylist licensed pursuant to this chapter.

1           8. Services performed by and for persons who are in the custody of  
2 the state department of corrections.

3           9. Persons who apply makeup, oils and cosmetics to patients in a  
4 hospital, nursing home or residential care institution with the consent of  
5 the patient and the hospital, nursing home or residential care  
6 institution.

7           10. Persons who provide a service that results in tension on hair  
8 strands or roots by twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking or  
9 braiding if the service does not include the application of dyes, reactive  
10 chemicals or other preparations to alter the color of the hair or to  
11 straighten, curl or alter the structure of the hair.

12           11. Persons who provide threading.

13           12. Persons who provide tanning services by means of airbrushing,  
14 tanning beds or spray tanning.

15           13. Persons who apply makeup, ~~including eyelash enhancements~~. This  
16 paragraph does not apply if a person is engaging in the practice of  
17 aesthetics or cosmetology. A person who is exempt pursuant to this  
18 paragraph shall post a sign in a conspicuous location in the person's  
19 place of business notifying the public that the person's services are not  
20 regulated by the board.

21           14. Persons who dry, style, arrange, dress, curl, hot iron or  
22 shampoo and condition hair if the service does not include applying  
23 reactive chemicals to permanently straighten, curl or alter the structure  
24 of the hair ~~and if the person takes and completes a class relating to~~  
25 ~~sanitation, infection protection and law review that is provided by the~~  
26 ~~board or its designee. This paragraph does not apply if a person is~~  
27 ~~engaging in the practice of aesthetics or cosmetology~~. A person who is  
28 exempt pursuant to this paragraph shall post a sign in a conspicuous  
29 location in the person's place of business notifying the public that the  
30 person's services are not regulated by the board.

31           15. Persons who are participating in a department of economic  
32 security-approved apprenticeship program as described in section 32-510,  
33 32-511, 32-512, 32-512.01 or 32-512.02 while working with a mentor in an  
34 establishment that is licensed by the board.

35           16. Persons who are licensed in another state and who are working  
36 in this state at a charitable event that benefits a nonprofit  
37 organization.

38           17. Persons who are licensed in another state, who are in this  
39 state for not more than two weeks and who provide services for persons who  
40 are attending an athletic, charitable, artistic or social event in this  
41 state.

42           18. Persons who are enrolled in a school that is licensed by the  
43 board and who shampoo, rinse and apply cream rinse, conditioners and  
44 reconstructors to hair, including hair that has been treated with color or  
45 bleach.

1           19. Persons who perform services without compensation in ~~either~~ ANY  
2 OF THE FOLLOWING:

3           (a) An emergency.

4           (b) A domestic administration.

5           (c) A CHARITABLE EVENT FOR A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION.

6           20. Persons who perform barbering, cosmetology, hairstyling or nail  
7 technology services in a funeral establishment as defined in section  
8 32-1301.

9           Sec. 5. Section 32-507, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
10 read:

11           32-507. Fees

12           A. The board shall establish and collect fees not to exceed the  
13 following:

14           1. Application for initial personal license, a onetime fee of \$100.

15           2. Application for personal reciprocity or universal license, a  
16 onetime fee of \$200.

17           3. Application for establishment license, including change of  
18 ownership, \$250.

19           4. Application for school license and initial inspection fee,  
20 including change of ownership and change of location, \$1,000.

21           5. Application for certification of licensure or hours, \$30.

22           6. Personal license renewal, \$100 to be paid once every two years  
23 pursuant to section 32-517 or 32-535.

24           7. Personal license delinquent renewal, \$150.

25           8. Establishment license after a change of location, ~~\$150~~ AN AMOUNT  
26 TO BE DETERMINED BY THE BOARD.

27           9. Establishment license renewal, \$100.

28           10. Establishment license delinquent renewal, \$150.

29           11. School license renewal, \$500.

30           12. School license delinquent renewal, \$600.

31           13. Delinquent penalties for each year or portion of a year for  
32 which the license was ~~inactive~~ EXPIRED.

33           14. Computer printouts of names of licensees, up to \$.10 per name.

34           15. Duplicate license, \$30.

35           16. Dishonored checks, \$20.

36           17. Copying charges, \$1 per page. For audiotapes, videotapes,  
37 computer discs or other mediums used for recording sounds, images or  
38 information, \$15 per tape, disc or other medium.

39           18. Board-administered educational classes, \$100.

40           19. Service charges for persons who pay with alternative payment  
41 methods, including credit cards, charge cards, debit cards and electronic  
42 transfers, not to exceed the cost of the alternative payment method.

43           20. Eyelash technician registration, an amount to be determined by  
44 the board.



1           21. Eyelash technician registration renewal, an amount to be  
2 determined by the board.

3           22. Eyelash technician registration delinquent renewal, an amount  
4 to be determined by the board.

5           B. The board may charge additional fees for:

6           1. Documents and publications provided by the board.

7           2. Services that the board deems appropriate to carry out its  
8 intent and purpose. These additional fees shall not exceed the costs of  
9 rendering the services.

10          Sec. 6. Section 32-510, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
11 read:

12          32-510. Aestheticians; applications; qualifications

13          A person is entitled to receive an aesthetician's license if the  
14 person:

15          1. Submits to the board an application for an aesthetician's  
16 license on a form supplied by the board.

17          2. Does either of the following:

18           (a) Completes and receives appropriate credits for at least two  
19 years of high school education or its equivalent as prescribed by the  
20 board in its rules and submits to the board satisfactory evidence that the  
21 person is at least sixteen years of age.

22           (b) Submits to the board satisfactory evidence that the person is  
23 at least eighteen years of age.

24          3. Submits to the board satisfactory evidence of any of the  
25 following:

26           (a) That the person is a graduate of an aesthetician school in  
27 another state or country that has substantially the same requirements as  
28 this state for schools licensed by the board.

29           (b) That the person is a graduate of an aesthetician course  
30 consisting of at least six hundred hours of training in a school licensed  
31 by the board.

32           (c) That the person completed a United States department of  
33 labor-approved or a department of economic security-approved  
34 apprenticeship program in aesthetics that includes at least two hundred  
35 hours of infection protection and law review instruction. The person  
36 shall complete the instruction prescribed by this subdivision through  
37 either:

38           (i) A school that is licensed by the board or a school or program

1           Sec. 7. Section 32-511, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
2 read:

3           32-511. Cosmetologists; applications; qualifications;  
4           exceptions

5           A. A person is entitled to receive a cosmetologist license if the  
6 person does all of the following:

7           1. Submits to the board an application for a cosmetologist license  
8 on a form supplied by the board.

9           2. Does either of the following:

10           (a) Completes and receives appropriate credits for at least two  
11 years of high school education or its equivalent as prescribed by the  
12 board in its rules and submits satisfactory evidence that the person is at  
13 least sixteen years of age.

14           (b) Submits to the board satisfactory evidence that the person is  
15 at least eighteen years of age.

16           3. Submits to the board satisfactory evidence of any of the  
17 following:

18           (a) That the person is a graduate of a cosmetology course  
19 consisting of at least one thousand five hundred hours of training in a  
20 school licensed by the board.

21           (b) That the person is a graduate of a cosmetology school in  
22 another state or country that had at the time of the person's graduation  
23 substantially the same requirements as this state for schools licensed by  
24 the board.

25           (c) That the person completed a United States department of  
26 labor-approved or a department of economic security-approved  
27 apprenticeship program in cosmetology that includes at least two hundred  
28 fifty hours of infection protection and law review instruction. The  
29 person shall complete the instruction prescribed by this subdivision  
30 through either:

31           (i) A school that is licensed ~~pursuant to this chapter~~ BY THE BOARD  
32 or a school or program in another state that has, in the board's opinion,  
33 licensure requirements that are substantially equivalent to the  
34 requirements of this state.

38           5. Pays the prescribed fees.

39           B. SUBSECTION A, PARAGRAPHS 2 AND 3 OF THIS SECTION DO NOT APPLY TO  
40 A PERSON WHO HAS AN ACTIVE BARBER LICENSE ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS  
41 CHAPTER. A PERSON WHO HAS AN ACTIVE BARBER LICENSE IS ENTITLED TO RECEIVE  
42 A COSMETOLOGY LICENSE IF THE PERSON SATISFACTORILY COMPLETES A THREE  
43 HUNDRED-HOUR COURSE CONSISTING OF COSMETOLOGY TECHNIQUES IN A SCHOOL  
44 LICENSED BY THE BOARD.

3       32-512. Nail technicians; applications; qualifications

4       A person is entitled to receive a license to practice nail  
5 technology if the person does all of the following:

6       1. Submits to the board an application for a nail technician  
7 license on a form supplied by the board.

8       2. Does either of the following:

9       (a) Completes and receives appropriate credits for at least two  
10 years of high school education or its equivalent as prescribed by the  
11 board in its rules and submits satisfactory evidence that the person is at  
12 least sixteen years of age.

13       (b) Submits to the board satisfactory evidence that the person is  
14 at least eighteen years of age.

15       3. Submits to the board satisfactory evidence of any of the  
16 following:

17       (a) That the person graduated from a nail technology school in  
18 another state or country that had at the time of the person's graduation  
19 substantially the same requirements as this state for schools licensed by  
20 the board.

21       (b) That the person completed a nail technician course consisting  
22 of at least six hundred hours of training in a school licensed by the  
23 board.

24       (c) That the person completed a United States department of  
25 labor-approved or a department of economic security-approved

39 read:

40       32-512.01. Hairstylists; applications; qualifications

41       A person is entitled to receive a HAIRSTYLIST license ~~to practice~~  
42 ~~hairstyling~~ if the person does all of the following:

43       1. Submits to the board an application for a hairstylist license on  
44 a form supplied by the board.

1           2. Either:

2           (a) Completes and receives appropriate credits for at least two  
3 years of high school education or its equivalent as prescribed by the  
4 board in its rules and submits satisfactory evidence that the person is at  
5 least sixteen years of age.

6           (b) Submits to the board satisfactory evidence that the person is  
7 at least eighteen years of age.

8           3. Submits to the board satisfactory evidence that the person meets  
9 any of the following:

10          (a) Graduated from a hairstyling school in another state or country  
11 that had at the time of the person's graduation substantially the same  
12 requirements as this state for schools licensed by the board.

13          (b) Completed a hairstylist course consisting of at least one  
14 thousand hours of training in a school licensed by the board.

15          (c) Completed a United States department of labor-approved or a  
16 department of economic security-approved apprenticeship program in
