AMENDING TITLE 13, CHAPTER 13, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES, BY ADDING SECTION 13-1311; RELATING TO CRIMES.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

2 Section 1. Title 13, chapter 13, Arizona Revised Statutes, is
3 amended by adding section 13-1311, to read:

4 13-1311. In-state custodial interference; civil liability;
5 classification

6 A. A PERSON COMMITS IN-STATE CUSTODIAL INTERFERENCE IF, KNOWING OR
7 HAVING REASON TO KNOW THAT THE PERSON HAS NO LEGAL RIGHT TO DO SO, THE
8 PERSON, WITH THE INTENT TO INTERFERE WITH A LAWFUL CUSTODY ORDER, TAKES,
9 ENTICES OR KEEPS FROM LAWFUL CUSTODY IN THIS STATE ANY CHILD FROM THE
10 CHILD'S PARENT, LEGAL GUARDIAN OR LAWFUL CUSTODIAN.

11 B. A PERSON WHO IS FOUND RESPONSIBLE FOR A FIRST VIOLATION OF THIS
12 SECTION OR A SECOND VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION COMMITTED WITHIN TEN YEARS
13 AFTER THE FIRST VIOLATION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF \$500.

14 C. A THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION IS A CLASS 6
15 FELONY.
