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## Representatives Syms and Hernandez Team Up to Help Victims of Sexual Assault

**STATE CAPITOL, PHOENIX** – Arizona law allows victims of domestic violence to end a lease without being liable for future rent payments or security deposits. Victims of sexual assault could gain those same potentially life-saving protections under a new bipartisan bill introduced on Friday.

Representatives Daniel Hernandez (D-2) and Maria Syms (R-28) introduced <u>HB 2454</u> on Friday, along with more than a dozen Republican and Democratic cosponsors. The Syms-Hernandez bill would close a loophole in the Arizona Landlord and Tenant Act to allow a person who was sexually assaulted in a rental unit – and who may not know the assailant – to end a lease and move without penalty.

"Not many people know this loophole existed, but a friend came to us last year and brought a situation to our attention," Hernandez said. "We wanted to find a bipartisan way to help victims of sexual assault and to make sure people feel safe in their homes."

"Victims of sexual assault suffer unspeakable trauma, and it is important to find ways to help them heal both physically and emotionally," said Representative Syms. "I am proud to work with my colleagues on this important bipartisan solution."

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
