Representative Kolodin Introduces Bill to Clarify Existing Election Law

STATE CAPITOL, PHOENIX – Arizona State Representative Alexander Kolodin released a statement today announcing the introduction of [House Bill 2022](#)—critical legislation to clarify existing Arizona election law.

Election integrity remains a top priority for Arizonans. In recent election cycles, certain glaring issues have stemmed simply from unclear statutes—particularly those governing election timelines and the presence of observers at voting locations.

Representative Kolodin’s bill addresses these issues by clarifying the following under Arizona law:

- Makes permanent the 2024 legislative fix aligning Arizona’s election timeline with the federal Electoral Count Reform Act, ensuring presidential election results are transmitted to Congress on time.
- Clarifies that, under existing law, each county party chairman may designate a party representative and alternates to serve as observers at every voting location.

“This is another commonsense measure that recent election cycles have demonstrated is critical to clean elections in Arizona,” said Representative Kolodin. **“The bill ensures that Arizonans will not be disenfranchised by Congress’ mistakes and clarifies that independent observers are permitted at all voting locations.”**
